1. CALL TO ORDER & AGENDA

Ms. Sarah Emerson called the meeting to order. All were welcomed to the meeting. Appreciate for participation was offered during this busy month.

2. OLD BUSINESS

2.1 UPDATED SENATE BILL 12

Senate Bill 12 continues to change. Hopefully, it will be resolved by the beginning of the next school year.

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2.2 IMMUNICATION AFFIDAVIT OF EXEMPTION

In the past, parents would have to visit the DSHS site to apply for exemption of immunization. Now, parents can visit the website to complete and print out the form. This has proven to be most helpful.

2.3 FLU SHOTS

Flu shot clinic was held November 12th. The turnout was lower than expected this year, largely due to limited vaccine availability. We are optimistic that holding the clinic in Mid-October next year will help improve participation and boost our numbers. Panhandle Family Care Clinic administered the vaccines and agreed to return next year.

3. NEW BUSINESS

3.1 SUMMER NUTRITION PROGRAM

Ms. Emerson reported the District would like to submit a request for waiver for participation. The Texas Department of Agriculture mandates public school authorities in the National School Lunch Program to operate a Summer Nutrition Program to provide meals to students in need during the summer months.

Ms. Emerson explained that the students that would utilize this program live outside the 2 mile radius of the school and they do not have access to public transportation. The burden of traveling to the school for lunch is too great for the students. They would have to cross railroad tracks and Highway 287 in many cases. Because of these limitations, our district qualifies for the wiaver.

These students will be given a number to call for information on local free lunches.

The waiver was approved.
